6. Highway safety issues –

Clr Justin smith reported he had met with Cty Clr Ged Mirfin and had prepared a petition on Change.org for a pedestrian crossing outside Sabden Primary School. The parish council and community facebook pages will be used to highlight/sign post the petition.

Clr K Galea agreed to join the working group alongside Clr Justin smith, it is hoped to engage with the community and schools and that 1 or 2 members of the community will join the group. Hopefully by publicizing the petition it will be a gateway for change.

7. Placement of CCTV at strategic locations in village

Clr James smith reported he had received a quote for CCTV at 3 locations which would be a minimum of $\pounds 10,000 + \pounds 100$ per month for maintenance/backup. A 2nd quotation from another company is awaited.

Clr James Smith reminded councillors of the GDPR responsibilities and suggested the starting point to future discussions should be aims/objectives/pressing needs/justification bearing in mind Section 2.4 of the Home Office Surveillance Camera Code of Practice

Clr K Galea suggested CCTV could be linked to Highway safety issues and that residents had expectations in making Sabden a safer place to live.

It was agreed further discussions will take place at the next meeting, RVBC will be contacted prior to this meeting to enquire about the possibility of funding. The chair asked councillors to prepare by considering aims/objectives/pressing need & justification.



8. Heritage project 'Calico & Clogs' update –

Clr M Pilkington presented sample boards & graphics and a draft of the logo. It is hoped to launch mid September in conjunction with the Pendle Hil Partnership Access for All trail. There is still a lot of work to do on the text.

9. Adoption of BT Phone Box

It was agreed the adoption contract be signed and a post on the website and facebook will inform everyone of progress. The councillors were pleased to see so much interest from the community.

10. Request by Sabden Football Club to hold a Duck Race

Sabden Football Club has requested permission to hold a Duck Race on Sunday 22nd August to raise much needed funds for the club.

RESOLVED all in favour of giving permission, reminding the organisers the cordon off the wildflower garden near Jubilee Bridge and asking for sight of the risk assessment and that H&S requirements are adhered to.

11. Review Boundary Commission proposals

The independent Boundary Commission for England (BCE) are redrawing the map of Parliamentary constituency boundaries, as part of that review, a consultation is now running to get feedback on proposed new boundary lines and constituency names.

The current proposals seek to alter the Ribble Valley constituency with some of our close neighbours i.e Whalley and Painter Wood; East Whalley Read and Simonstone and Langho and Billington moving into an extended Hyndburn Parliamentary Constituency.

Whilst the current proposals will not affect Sabden councillors believe it is important to respond to the consultation to acknowledge that Sabden is well aligned in the Ribble Valley constituency being a rural area in AONB, similar to many parishes in RV, with close ties to Clitheroe – main town- local government offices easily accessible, secondary education is within Ribble Valley and many healthcare appointments are at Clitheroe Hospital.
