7. Environmental Issues

Consideration was given to the Tree Planting programme -Saturday 15th March 10am Trees/shrubs from the Woodland Trust have been delivered.

Clr. M Dawson presented extensive plans of suggested locations with count of species along with detailed information about each of the species

Councillors considered the various locations

RESOLVED Planting will take place on the right and left hand side of Clitheroe Rd from no.157 to cattle grid, along the Brookside on the Lower Holme field and on Chestnut green. Also pending approval from Ribble Valley the 3 following locations- River walk, Pendle street east and Bowling Green triangle.

Tree guards and stakes are being provided by A. Galling and staking out will take place in advance of Planting.

Community Litter Pick – 8th March 10am- meet at the car park on Clitheroe Rd

Clr S Clarke has 12 sets of Litter Pickers and Bin liners. All rubbish collected will be taken to the village car park from where RVBC will collect.

8. Consideration was given to the Best Kept Village entry 2025

Clr. S Clarke outlined the competition the aims which are to encourage, through community effort and involvement, a high standard of care and maintenance of all village features, properties and public areas. She explained this competition differs from Village in Bloom which focuses more on beautification through floral displays. There will be 2 rounds of judging during which She also reminded councillors of the judges comments from the 2024 competition.

Outstanding Features were proposed as follows – Schools Nurseries – St Mary's RC School War Memorial Play Area – Lower Holme Notice Board – Watt Street Shop – The Village Nook Village Pub /restaurant – The White Hart Inn Industrial /Commercial - Specialised Automotive Services Cultural Social Interest -Calico & Clogs Heritage Trail Bowling Green Clr S Clarke will seek consent from those proposed

Area for Exclusion -Falcon House its surrounds and car park - lack of cooperation from the owner

There was a suggestion to increase summer planting, the clerk pointed out summer planting comes at substantial cost to the council, Clr S Clarke said she will be asking the community for more planters -all to be maintained by donor- so this would not increase councils costs.

The clerk mentioned the Green Back Streets initiative and and advised the Biodiversity Grant (£300) could help with this.
